

Drunk fire dept staff barges into MDMK office, damages assets

A personnel with the state fire and rescue services department, allegedly drunk, barged into the head office of the Marumalarchi Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (MDMK) at Egmore on Monday evening and hurled stones and damaged the properties inside the office.

According to the Egmore police, the man, identified as Al Gore (25) of Mannargudi working with the fire department, was wearing the uniform at the time. After entering the office, he removed the shirt and went to the second floor of the building, the police said.

The police detained the man and took him to the police station for inquiry. Sources said he gave contradictory answers, during questioning.

The police suspect Al Gore to be suffering from mental illness. He has been admitted to a mental health institution at Kilpauk.

THE Greater Chennai Police (GCP) is set to come up with a detailed Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) including an enhanced patrol in areas around the Chennai International Airport to curb the menace of laser lights aiming at flights landing at the airport.

A meeting in this regard was chaired by N Kannan IPS, additional commissioner, GCP with Airports Authority of India (AAI), Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS), Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) and other agencies at the airport on June 11.

Kannan was shown a presentation by AAI which indicated that the laser problem was being faced by pilots landing their aircraft from the St Thomas Mount and Pallavaram end of the air strip. Agencies have also collected geolocation data regarding where the lights could have come from.

According to official sources, the agencies have decided to come up with a joint action plan to curb this menace and take strict action against perpetrators. The personnel from the St Thomas Mount police district, under which the airport falls, will carry out enhanced patrolling in the vicinity and file cases against those found to be involved in this.

Another important change in

the SOP will be to get written complaints from AAI for the police to file cases. Currently, only oral complaints are being given, a senior official said.

There have been multiple cases of pointing laser lights at incoming flights recently. GCP has issued a warning that this could distract pilots while landing.

In 2025, there have been 25 instances of laser lights pointed at landing aircraft. In 2024, AAI had recorded 70 such instances, an increase from 51 in 2023, sources said.

A senior police official said based on preliminary investigation, the lights were likely to be originating from parties or music events/concerts which use laser lights and were inadvertently pointed towards the flights.

Any such use of laser beam or other lights are prohibited under section 223 (a) of BNS, 2023 that bans laser lights and drones near airport. Similarly, Rule 65 and 66 of Aircraft Rules, 1937 regulate laser lights and other aerial activities near the airport, GCP said. Additionally, shining a laser beam at an aircraft is a serious offence and falls under Sec 125 of BNS which is defined as "Act endangering life or personal safety of others", GCP said in a recent caution notice.

Man beaten to death at Marina beach for harassing trans woman

A 50-year-old man was beaten to death at Marina beach for allegedly harassing a trans woman on Sunday night. The Marina police have arrested two persons, including the trans woman.

The deceased has been identified as Venkatesan, running a shop at the beach. The police said he usually sleeps there at night.

The arrested have been identified as Rakesh (25), an auto driver from Royapettah, and the trans woman, a minor. Investigations revealed that Venkatesan had misbehaved with the trans woman, following which she along with the auto driver attacked him, the police said. The duo has been remanded in judicial custody.

The incident happened near

the sand stretch behind the Netaji statue, where the police found the man with head injuries. He was rushed to the hospital but died soon after. The body was sent to Royapettah Government Hospital for postmortem, the police said.

The police said the CCTV footage show the trans woman and the auto rickshaw driver attacking the man with wooden logs and stones.

Kanchi NGO trustee among five arrested for African ivory trade

CHENNAI Customs (Seaport) on Saturday seized 1.5 kg of African elephant tusks (ivory) from a building in Irungattukottai near Sriperumbudur and arrested five including the main trustee of an NGO in Kancheepuram district.

According to sources, the Special Investigation and Intelli-

gence Branch (SIIB) of Chennai Customs got secret information

about some persons in Kanchipuram district involved in illicit trade of ivory, which is banned under the Wildlife Protection Act.

Sources said the Customs received a tip-off that P Muthukumar was selling the ivory to a potential buyer on Saturday at a hideout. Based on information, the Customs sleuths landed at the spot and caught the persons

red-handed.

The other suspects have been identified as Mohammed Ismail, Mohammed Shakil Ahmed, NA Azeefullah and Amarnath. They were allegedly the commission agents and middlemen involved in the trade. Muthukumar is a trustee of an NGO which offers courses on tailoring and skill development in the district.

The ivory and the suspects were handed over to Tiruvallur District Forest Officer (DFO) who has registered a case.

This is the second ivory racket that Chennai Customs busted in the last two months. In April, a 67-year-old jeweller T Prabhakaran and his son P Diwakar (42) were arrested from KK Nagar for possession and trade of 25 kg of ivory.

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Madurai floats tender for ₹34-L dog shelter

THE city corporation has floated a tender to construct a special dog shelter in Ward 31 for ₹34 lakh to bring down the stray dog population.

Officials from the city corporation stated that following the recent stray dog census, there are nearly 38,000 stray dogs in the city. As part of this, the corporation has planned to renovate the extension room at Dr Thangaraj Road in Ward 31 into a dog shelter facility, and the renovation works will be carried out at nearly ₹34 lakh.

Officials from the city health department stated that there are already temporary shelters at Sellur and Vellakkal areas; notably, dogs that are taken for the ABC process would be kept in the shelters. Considering the number of dogs, the corporation has been planning to build an additional shelter in Ward 31, with separate kennels. Activists have urged the corporation to take action towards promoting adoption and proper monitoring to prevent the straying of puppies to bring down the increasing stray dog population.

Don't dump waste into open drains: Corpn commissioner

such issues. A senior corporation official said that on Monday, workers were deputed to seek out the drain issue, and upon cleaning, workers found a large amount of cow dung dumped into the canal, which led to the clogging.

Corporation commissioner Chitra Vijayan, she said awareness is being given to residents on not dumping solid waste or cow dung in open drains. The corporation has also started UGD works, and proper maintenance is being done to open drains to address the issue.

Sewage floods school, class held at community hall

AROUND 100 students of Thirupurankundam Panchayat Union Middle School in Chinthamani were forced to attend classes at a nearby community hall on Monday, after sewage water from the Kirthuthu river inundated their

school campus.

The incident occurred due to the negligence of Water Resources Department (WRD) officials, who had blocked a sewage channel as part of ongoing bridge construction work near the school. As a result, sewage water overflowed and entered the school premises on Friday evening.

Despite residents alerting civic authorities over the weekend, no action was taken, leaving the campus waterlogged when students arrived for classes on Monday. Teachers initially made students sit in front of a nearby temple, before corporation officials arranged for the community hall to be cleaned and made available for

classes. When contacted, a WRD official admitted that the sewage flow was temporarily blocked for bridge construction, which led to the flooding. "We have now drained the water from the school campus and will ensure such incidents do not recur," the official added.

Bike taxi rider held for slapping woman passenger

Video of roadside altercation in Bengaluru's Jayanagar goes viral, CCTV footage shows woman hitting him first

A Rapido bike taxi rider was detained and a police case registered against him after a video showing him slapping a woman passenger during a roadside altercation in Bengaluru's Jayanagar went viral.

However, fresh CCTV footage has now emerged, showing that the woman appeared to have hit the rider first.

The incident occurred on Friday morning when the woman, reportedly a saleswoman at

a jewellery store in Jayanagar, was on her way to work. She alleged that the rider was driving rashly and jumped traffic signals. Distressed by the unsafe riding, she got off the vehicle midway and confronted him.

The woman refused to pay the fare and return the helmet which triggered a verbal altercation between the two.

The viral video, shot by a passerby, shows the man slapping the woman with such force that she falls to the ground, sparking public outrage. Speaking to reporters, the rider, Suman S,

claimed he was provoked and assaulted first. "She hit me twice with a tiffin box, abused me, and grabbed my collar.

That's when I reacted," he said. He admitted, however, to telling her to "go back to your country," which has drawn criticism online. The woman told media persons that the rider had violated traffic rules and claimed, "He should not have attacked me. I made the payment and gave the helmet back."

Reacting to the rider's controversial remark, she added, "These Kannadigas have a language issue. They want us to either learn their language or leave." Initially unwilling to file a complaint, the woman

was later sent a notice by the police, following which a formal FIR was registered under the BNS. Meanwhile, transport officials started the crackdown on Monday morning and were seizing vehicles operating illegally, slapping fines ranging from ₹5,000 to ₹10,000.

Netizens claimed that the bike taxi service providers may have halted the 'bike taxi' services, but are continuing in the guise of 'bike parcel service'.

Transport Commissioner Yogesh told they will continue their crackdown.

Initiative aims to reduce loss, improve efficiency

OFFICIALS further told TNIE that the state is proceeding cautiously, mindful of the challenges faced by a similar scheme launched in Andhra Pradesh in 2021 and discontinued in May this year.

Currently, Tamil Nadu has 24,800 full-time ration shops and 10,355 part-time shops catering to 2.21 crore ration cardholders.

"Cooperative societies managing ration shops have a robust transportation network for moving goods procured by the Tamil Nadu Civil Supplies Corporation. These societies manage 35,000 ration shops. Therefore,

rolling out door delivery will not face any logistical hurdles," an official added.

Besides supporting people who face barriers in accessing the PDS, the initiative is expected to aid in streamlining and improving the efficiency in usage of storage spaces, especially in warehouses, and thereby minimising losses since the door delivery of goods in bulk would be done within the first week of every month.

The state has issued over 18.45 lakh Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) cards to the poorest households, each eligible to receive 35kg of rice per month, some of whom may become eligible for the door delivery scheme as well.

36 arrested in three days of anti-drug crackdown

In a determined bid to curb the rising menace of drug abuse, the Coimbatore District Police launched a massive three-day anti-drug operation titled 'Operation - Drug Free Coimbatore' from June 13 to 15.

The operation, executed across the district under the direct supervision of Coimbatore District Superintendent of Police Dr K Karthikeyan, resulted in the arrest of 36 individuals and the seizure of 10,150 kg of ganja.

A total of 89 special teams comprising more than 300 police personnel were mobilised for the drive, operating under the leadership of Sub-Divisional DSPs.

The teams worked with a detailed database of 927 individuals with prior links to gang-related cases, compiled using intelligence inputs and confidential sources. As many as 461 individuals were questioned and searched during the operation. Police recovered ganja in possession of 36 individuals, leading to the registration of 33 cases.

All 36 were arrested, of whom 10 have been remanded to judicial custody. The operation marks a significant step in the district's ongoing efforts to dismantle local drug networks, especially those targeting college youth and vulnerable

communities.

SP Dr K Karthikeyan emphasised the department's resolve. "Those involved in illegal activities such as drug trafficking, which are harmful to society, will not escape the watchful eyes of the police. Intensive surveillance and action will continue. Public cooperation is crucial in protecting our youth."

He urged citizens to remain alert and report any suspicious activities to the police, assuring that the identity of informants would be kept confidential. Further investigations are ongoing to trace the supply chain and nab key offenders identified during the operation.

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Faulty streetlights spark fears in Valparai

ALLEGING inadequate maintenance of streetlights, residents of Valparai Town expressed concern over wild animals' intrusion into the town during night. "Streetlights in Valparai and estate areas of Coimbatore district are not working properly in recent days. People of the hill area are facing a lot of difficulties due to the lack of streetlights. Despite repeated complaints with the municipal administration, repair works are not carried out soon after the lights turn faulty," said P Paramasivam, secretary of

CPM in Valparai. "The street-light maintenance was handed over to a private player in the hill town a year ago. They take a long time to rectify issues if streetlights turn faulty. When we take up the issue with the councillors and administration, they do not listen. During the night hours, wild animals' movement, especially towards bears and elephants, is a cause of concern. As the streetlights do not work, people are being attacked by these animals. Recently, a woman was killed by a wild elephant near Soleyar Dam in Valparai at night as there were no streetlights," he said.

He urged the administration to rectify the issue without further delay.

Arumugam, municipal engineer of Valparai, said, "Valparai municipality has over 3,500 streetlights. Of this, 75% of the lights are maintained by private contractors, while the rest are maintained by the municipality. Due to continuous rains and winds, these lights turn faulty, often just days after maintenance. We are prioritising the fix the faulty streetlights at the earliest."

Reimburse ₹770 crore RTE dues to TN: MMI

MARUMALARCHI Maklal Iyakkam (MMI) on Monday sent a letter to Union Minister of Education Dharmendra Pradhan, urging the immediate reimbursement of around ₹770 crore dues for Tamil Nadu under the Right to Education (RTE) Act, as per Madras High Court's direction.

In a letter, MMI president V Easwaran said admissions under the RTE Act are held in around 7,600 private schools across the state every

year, and a total of 1,37,857 children from weaker sections were enrolled in kindergarten sections in schools last academic year. As per the norm, tuition fees are paid to private schools in a 60:40 fund sharing ratio between the central and state governments. As per state government's data, as the central government's share of ₹153.70 crore for academic year 2021-2022 and ₹188.90 crore for academic year 2022-2023 were not received, the state government paid ₹748.02 crore, including the central

government's share, to private schools for both years. The contributions of central government are ₹208.2 crore for 2023-2024 and ₹222.60 crore for 2024-2025. Consequently, the central government's outstanding payment is ₹773.49 crore to the state government for the RTE scheme.

Easwaran told TNIE that since the state government did not start RTE admissions this academic year, he filed a petition in the Madras High Court last month seeking to start admissions.

CM announces slew of multi-crore infra projects in Thanjai

CHIEF Minister M K Stalin announced a slew of new infrastructure projects for Thanjavur on Monday. These include construction of a bridge at a cost of ₹42 crore at the Vettanaduvu River Head (VVR head) in Thenperambur village.

The other schemes announced by the CM include widening of the Grand Anicut canal road between Eechangokottai and Vettikadu at a cost of ₹40 crore and the renovation of the Uyyakondan extension canal that passes through several villages in Budalur taluk, at a cost of ₹15 crore.

The other major announcements made at the meeting in-

cluded a new warehouse for paddy at a cost of ₹170 crore at Naduvur and creation of SIPCOT industrial estates at Palayapatti and Rajamadam. The chief minister also said the work will begin shortly for a fishing jetty for the benefit of Eripurakkari, Kozhathottam to be constructed at a cost of ₹32 crore.

Earlier, the chief minister inaugurated new buildings constructed at a total cost of ₹326 crore.

He also laid foundation stones for new projects worth ₹300 crore. Besides, Chief Minister Stalin inaugurated the issuing of various welfare assistance to 2.25 lakh beneficiaries at a total cost of ₹558 crore.

No maintenance, plants on Thiruvanaikovil bridge wither

ONCE hailed as a beautification initiative, the ornamental plants placed in colourful square-shaped pots at the median of Thiruvanaikovil bridge have now become a neglected sight, with many plants dried out and several pots damaged.

The lack of maintenance and action from authorities has drawn criticism from local residents and visitors alike.

Around 40 potted ornamental plants were installed along the bridge median in 2023, aiming to enhance the visual appeal of the area frequently used

by pilgrims travelling to Srirangam.

Initially praised for its aesthetic contribution, the setup now stands in a dilapidated state due to poor upkeep and vandalism.

"It was an impressive initiative, but it has lost its charm. About six pots have been destroyed by miscreants. We urge the authorities to replace the dried plants and repaint the pots," said Shekar Babu, a resident of Srirangam.

Residents also raised concerns over similar projects in other parts of the city, such as Puthur Junction, Thenmuru and

other locations, where ornamental plants are reportedly in poor condition.

"Such initiatives appear to be a waste of public funds. If the

authorities cannot maintain them, why are they implementing them? Even if it was done through sponsorship, it is still money poorly spent," remarked

P K Vijaykumar, a senior citizen from Anna Nagar.

When contacted, a senior corporation official assured that necessary action would be taken. "We are conducting regular watering and maintenance of ornamental plants across the city. Zonal inspection teams are instructed to check on such issues. We will ensure proper follow-up in this case as well," the official said.

Residents hope swift action will be taken to restore the beautification efforts and maintain the city's visual appeal, especially in prominent locations like Thiruvanaikovil bridge.

Family of Pachamalai's first law student seeks govt aid for shelter, livelihood

EVEN as S Bharath, a student from Thonur hamlet, made history by becoming the first tribal student in the Pachamalai hills to crack the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT), his family continues to live in a crumbling one-room hut and is appealing for support to improve both their living conditions and livelihood.

With the monsoon fast approaching, Bharath's family is urgently seeking help to rebuild their deteriorating home. They also hope the district administration will help them to procure a subsidised price or even support to set up a small business, which could provide a more stable source of income.

Bharath was honoured by the Tiruchy collector on Monday,

with a cheque for ₹25,000 towards meeting his educational expenses. However, back in their village, his family of six continues to live under a roof made of asbestos sheets, with walls battered by years of weather.

Though the Rural Development Department has extended some repair aid, the structure remains leaky and unsafe.

His father, A. Selvakumar, a daily-wage labourer, earns about ₹500 on days he finds work.

"Some days I get construction work. Otherwise, I grow tapioca in a small patch of land to repay debts. If we had tractor procured for a subsidised price, or even a small business set up, we could earn regularly," he said.

"During Monday's interaction, the collector encouraged the family to submit specific requests. If they do, their case can be considered for housing or livelihood support," a Tribal Welfare Planning Officer told TNIE, adding that a visit to the hamlet would be arranged soon.

"My son has made us proud, but we hope this moment brings more than honour. His success should open doors for all of us," Selvakumar added.

Woman killed, four injured in car-bus collision near Thuraiyur

A woman died and four others suffered serious injuries in a collision between a car and private bus near Pulivalam near Thuraiyur on Monday. The deceased was identified as R Regiabegum (49) from Samayapuram. An infant in the car escaped unhurt.

According to police, M Raghubhasha (54) of Samayapuram was returning home with his wife Regiabegum, mother M Hairun Nisha (75), niece Bashila (25) and her one-year-old child, and Bashila's brother Alam (15) after applying for a pension scheme for Hairun Nisha in Thuraiyur on Monday after-

noon. He was driving the car.

When they were near a private school in Pulivalam, Raghubhasha tried to overtake a government bus but collided head-on with a private bus that was coming from the opposite direction.

In the impact, Regiabegum died on the spot, while Raghub-

hasha, Hairun Nisha, Bashila, and Alam sustained injuries. The infant escaped unhurt, added the sources.

Pulivalam police rescued the injured, and admitted them to a private hospital in Tiruchy. Regiabegum's body was sent to MGMH for post-mortem. A case has been registered.
