ADAPT's services include assessment, infant stimulation, therapy, counseling, inclusive education, skills training and job placement, continuum of support services and home management programs for children and young adults with disability.

ADAPT interacts with national and international organizations, public and private sectors, and Government agencies at all levels to influence policy changes that impact marginalized groups across the country.

To address the developmental needs of the rural population in India, the organization is now moving towards creating an inclusive village model through – The Mithu Alur Foundation, a new project under the aegis of ADAPT. Project Nanhi Kali is executed in partnership with The K. C. Mahindra Education Trust which was founded by the late Mr. K. C. Anand Mahindra is the founder of project Nanhi Kali. Since 2005, Project Nanhi Kali is jointly managed by the K. C. Mahindra Education Trust (KCMET) and Naandi Foundation (an independent and reputed not-for-profit organization) that has an objective of providing 10 years of quality education to girls from economically disadvantaged families.

Nanhi Kali is a sponsorship project that was started by Anand Mahindra in 1996, with the aim of breaking the vicious circle of poverty in India by educating the girl child. In partnership with 21 others NGOs that help the Nanhi Kali project to implement its cause at the grass root level to ensure that the girls receive Academic, Material and Social support.
